



Immigrant Stories and Timeline Immigration is about us all - those who were here and those who came.

Settling into a new country is not easy. Immigrants have to adapt to an unfamiliar environment and lifestyle, while maintaining aspects of their previous culture and way of life. Many newcomers spent their new lives in limbo, spending months in temporary migrant accommodation, committed to two year labour contracts. For others, settlement has been far easier because they spoke English, or government had offered assistant land or home scheme.



Generations of immigrants have had to adapt to a new climate, new landscape, new language, new currency, and new lifestyle, especially those who have settled in rural areas.

Each immigrant has their own unique story to tell. Whilst for many it was difficult, the vast majority eventually found their feet.

This gallery explores why they came, where they settled and how they started a new life in Victoria. Around the walls of the gallery is an immigration timeline that highlights key events in the history of immigration.

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#### What's on in Germany in June?

In June, Germany's summer festival season is in full swing, and you can catch some of the best German events and festivals.

Many festivities will be outdoors, so you can fully enjoy Germany's warm June weather.

#### **Handel Festival**

Halle, the birthplace of composer Georg Friedrich Handel, pays tribute to the German composer by hosting the annual Handel Festival. Come to hear international musicians interpret Handel's works, from his early chamber music and Italian cantatas, to the Messiah.

#### **Rock am Ring Music Festival**

More than 150,000 rock music fans gather each summer at the race track of the Nuremburg Ring to get up and get down at "Rock am Ring", Germany's biggest open air music festival. The star-studded line-up of international rock bands keeps the fans dancing for all three days.

#### **Bach Festival in Leipzig**

This world-class music festival in Leipzig commemorates the life and work of the city's most famous resident, Johann Sebastian Bach. Renowned artists from all over the world perform Bach's classical masterpieces in historical venues like the *Thomaskirche* (Thomas Church), where Bach worked as a cantor for 27 years.

#### Women's World Cup 2011

In 2011, the soccer World Cup is coming back to Germany: The FIFA women's world cup will take place in nine German cities; the opening game will be held at the Olympic Stadium in <u>Berlin</u>; other world cup venues include <u>Dresden</u>, Moenchengladbach, Augsburg, Sinsheim, Bochum, Wolfsburg and Leverkusen.

The final match will be held in Frankfurt.

#### **Carnival of Cultures**



The Berlin Carnival of the Cultures is a four-day street fair with exotic food and drinks, concerts, and parties, celebrating the multicultural spirit of Germany's capital. The highlight of the colourful festivities is the parade on Sunday, when performers, decorated floats, and musicians from over 70 different countries dance through the streets of Berlin Kreuzberg.
