#### CHOIR NEWS-NORFOLK ISLAND FRIENDSHIP TOUR 9-18 OCTOBER 2016

The friendliness of the "Islanders was immediately apparent and our stay at the Trade Winds Cottages was a home away from home. Burnt Pine, the island's centre is very much geared for tourism. The Island is very beautiful with green rolling hills surrounded by Norfolk pines, rugged coastlines and magnificent views wherever you go. Chickens and cows have the freedom to roam wherever they choose; they are the councils lawnmowers.

We were invited to speak on radio and the weekly newspaper also had reports about us to tell their appreciation for the visit to Norfolk Island and for bringing the European culture in song. Our first concert was at the St. Barnabas Chapel with stained glass windows and beautiful old pews. It had excellent acoustics which suited sacred songs and a mixture of the alpine songs. The main concert took place at the Ferny Lane Theatre with our full repertoire featuring the alpenhorn, rolling plates, cowbells and the yodel song. We sang at the school of 200 children who were so excited about the instruments that they kept clapping to the beat. We had a request to sing for the elderly at the hospital. We also had an invitation from proprietor of Trade Winds to visit her home. We sang on the edge of the cliff for all her friends and we were rewarded with a most delicious dinner. In between concerts we all kept busy with shopping, sightseeing, markets, Botanic Garden, National Park, climbing Mt.Pitt, Captain Cook Memorial, glass bottom boat, Convict Kingston Tour, Art Trail, Colleen McCullough home, Fletcher Christian Mutiny Cyclorama, Pitcairn Settlers, driving around the Island many times. Even though the Island is very small; only 8km long and 4km wide, there was not enough time to see and experience everything.
