


#### 3RD OCTOBER - DAY OF GERMAN UNITY

Following World War II, the area that was Germany was divided into four military sectors controlled by France, the United Kingdom, the United States and the Soviet Union. On May 23, 1949, the sectors controlled by France, the United Kingdom and the United States became the Federal Republic of Germany. On October 7, 1949, the sector controlled by the Soviet Union became the German Democratic Republic.

The two countries developed very different political and economic systems and, due to the political tensions in post-war Europe, there was little contact between the inhabitants of the two countries. A protest against the German Democratic Republic's government occurred in Leipzig on September 4, 1989. More demonstrations took place across the German Democratic Republic.

The protests called for political reform and to open the borders. On November 9, 1989, the checkpoints between the two countries were opened and people were allowed to travel freely. This date marked the "fall" of the Berlin wall.

These events lead to political change. Democratic elections paved the way for unity in the German Democratic Republic on March 18, 1990. The "Treaty of Unification" was signed by both countries' leaders in August that year. Finally, Germany's unification became official on October 3, 1990.

The Brandenburg Gate and the Berlin wall were two important symbols of Germany's division following World War II and Berlin's and Germany's unification in 1990. Images of the Brandenburg Gate and the Berlin wall's destruction are often displayed on German Unity Day. The German unification treaty also symbolizes the day and its meaning.

**Oktoberfest** in Bavaria is the highlight of Germany's festival calendar: Every September and October, over visitors from around the world mingle with locals to celebrate Bavarian culture and cuisine and to have a good time with German beer, music, parades, concerts, and fun rides.

#### Stuttgart Beer Festival - Cannstatter Wasen

The Cannstatter Wasen, as this festival is called in German, started as an autumn fair in 1818 and quickly became one of the leading beer festivals in Germany, second only to Oktoberfest in Munich. People can enjoy Swabian food, beer and wine and Oompah bands, parades, roller coasters....etc.

#### Frankfurt Book Fair

The Frankfurt Book Fair, annually held in October, is the world's largest trade show of books and the place to be for book lovers, publishers, translators, and authors. During the week, the book fair is only open to accredited trade-visitors, but on the last weekend of the fair, everybody can take a peek into the international world of media. There are readings, exhibitions, concerts, and films alongside the presentation of books.

#### Festival of Lights in Berlin

During the Festival of Lights, more than 45 of Berlin's most iconic landmarks and historic buildings will be illuminated from 7 p.m. until 1 a.m. every night. The Festival with its laser shows, light projections, and fireworks transforms the Berlin TV Tower, the Museums Island, the Brandenburg Gate, and many more attractions into magical visions. Special "lightseeing tours" are offered by bus, boat, or bicycle.

#### Classic Tomato Chutney - Recipe from Jeanette Brennan

1.5 kg ripe tomatoes, peeled and chopped

2 ½ cups white wine vinegar

½ cup sultanas

1 large onion, chopped

1 clove garlic, chopped

1 tblsp salt

4 whole cloves

½ teaspoon cayenne pepper

1/3 cup caster sugar

In a large saucepan, combine all the ingredients, except the sugar. Simmer on medium to high heat until mixture comes to the boil. Reduce heat to low and simmer for one and a half hours until tomatoes soften.

Stir in sugar until dissolved; bring to the boil and cook for a further 25 minutes, stirring frequently until the mixture thickens.

Pour chutney into sterilised jars and seal. Store in a cool dry cupboard for up to 3 months. Keep in the fridge after opening.
