

German Birth Certificates: Wieso, weshalb, warum?

A German birth certificate shows the birth of a person has been entered with a German Registrar of Births, Deaths and Marriages (Standesamt) into an official register in Germany. Based on this entry a new birth certificate can be issued anytime. For German passport applications, an original birth certificate always needs to be shown – be it an Australian or German one. The advantage of a German one is that it is fully recognized by German law as proof of descent, it shows the legal parents since descent of a person is verified at time of entry. The proof does not have to be produced again later in life if a German certificate can be shown. This can be very useful if a person moves to Germany or needs to prove their descent for a new passport, and in cases involving multiple countries or nationalities or where the parents were not married at time of birth.

If lost, a new German birth certificate can be issued based on the register. This process is guite simple: Write to the Standesamt of your birth (or the birth of a close relative) in Germany and request a new International Birth Certificate, attaching a copy of the German passport of the person concerned (and possibly yourself if not for you). This can be done by email or mail. The new birth certificate is issued once a payment of 10 EUR has been received, it is in several languages (including English) and will be mailed to your Tasmanian address. Registers in Germany are usually kept for 110 years until archived, so there is time to even complete the family documents with new birth certificates for past generations if desired. The Federal Foreign Office (Auswärtiges Amt) does not have birth records, those are only kept with the Standesamt. If you or your parents were not born in Germany, it is usually the Standesamt I in Berlin which will hold your records – if you are registered. All new registrations of persons born abroad now go to the last place of residence of parents in Germany.

Registration of a birth is possible anytime through the Honorary Consulate in Hobart and costs A\$ 200-250. Applications will be certified and sent it to the appropriate Register in Germany.
